Attached is Shell Canada's **Consultation Report** for the period **December 2013 to January 2014** (with some information from February 2014), as stipulated on November 28, 2007 from Alberta Environment as per the cover letter in the Terms of Reference for the **Jackpine Mine Expansion** and **Pierre River Mine** projects. I have also attached a revised version of the July 2013 to November 2013 record of consultation, with some additional information that was not included in the original version.

Please note, Shell has confirmed previously with Alberta Environment that the consultation reports will continue to be filed with regulators in the current format and bi-monthly frequency until such time the Approval Director is able to determine that the consultation activities are adequate for these Projects.

The water crossings that will be used in the 2013-2014 OSE program are temporary snow fill type crossings and will be constructed using clean snow and ice. Environmental controls will be in place to ensure contamination from equipment will not occur.</p> <p>Shell consulted with the trapper for TPA 1714, no concerns noted. Shell would not impede access to the trapline or prevent ACFN members from using it for traditional use activities. Potential impacts on other local wildlife are not expected to be significant. Shell will follow a wildlife mitigation plan. Shell will follow its geohazard drilling protocol. Construction techniques, such as gaps in windrows of woody debris or snow, will be employed to ensure that there are no barriers to wildlife movement along winter roads. To reduce predatory line of sight, for wildlife, all new cut for the 2013-2014 program will be approximately 100 m to 200 m in length. Shell follows the Code of Practice for Exploration Projects (ESRD, 2005) for reclamation, and also conducts its reclamation activities as per the criteria in the ESRD External Directive Number SD2010-01, Coal and Oil Sand Exploration Reclamation Requirements (ESRD, 2010).</p>	<p>Letter from ACFN indicating outstanding concerns regarding the program including: adequacy of consultation and how it has been represented, impacts of OSE program as asserted by Shell and mitigation measures proposed, capacity to consult, impacts to TLU, impacts to trapline 1714, impacts to Caribou and other wildlife, impacts to Treaty and Aboriginal rights.</p> <p>Shell provided its record of consultation to the Crown and has asked for a decision on adequacy for the program.</p>
