

Request for Public Comment

Draft Environmental Assessment Report – Best Theratronics Class 1B Licence Application

The Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission (CNSC) invites public comment on the draft Environmental Assessment (EA) Report for the Class 1B Nuclear Facility Licence application by Best Theratronics Limited at their Ottawa, Ontario facility.

The EA is being conducted pursuant to the requirements of the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act*.

The public comment period ends on **March 4, 2013**.

The EA Report, prepared by CNSC staff, is based on an Environmental Impact Statement and supporting documents prepared by Best Theratronics Limited.

CNSC staff will review and address all comments received before submitting the EA Report to the Commission for approval and decision under the *Canadian Environmental Assessment Act*.
