## SUBJECT: Outcome of conformity review of the Environmental Impact Statement

On February 14, 2020, the Impact Assessment Agency of Canada (the Agency) received the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) and EIS Summary for the BHP Canada Exploration Drilling Project (the Project) from BHP Petroleum (New Ventures) Corporation (the proponent). The Agency reviewed the EIS and EIS Summary in consideration of the requirements of the *Guidelines for the Preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement* (EIS Guidelines), issued to the proponent by the Agency on June 28, 2019.

The Agency has concluded that the EIS and EIS Summary contain sufficient information to commence the technical review of the documents and the associated public and Indigenous comment period. This decision does not imply that the information provided is adequate to support the completion of the environmental assessment, and the Agency may request further information after the technical review is complete. The EIS and EIS Summary will be posted on the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry Internet Site to invite comments by the public and Indigenous peoples during the comment period, which will begin immediately and end on April 4, 2020.

As of March 5, 2020, the federal legal timeline within which the Minister's decision must be made will begin.
