Early Engagement

- Early and ongoing engagement is a key focus for GCT in order to share Project-specific information and work collaboratively to find solutions that address issues and concerns.
- **Since 2016, 100+ meetings have occurred** in person or virtual with municipalities, Regulatory Authorities, community and business associations, and NGOs to share Project information.
- GCT has also been engaging with 51 Indigenous nations represented by 33 Indigenous organizations; 17 of which have submitted notices to engage as Participating Indigenous Nations.
- Committed to keep the lines of communication open, to be responsive and to build meaningful relationships.





Incorporating Feedback

Since the September 2020 submission of the Initial Project Description, GCT has continued to advance the Project, including updates to Project activities, schedule, alternative means of carrying out the Project, and options to reduce the overall Project effects based on feedback received through early engagement.

Recent updates include:

Impact Assessment approach in consideration of the Nov 8th Draft Joint Guidelines, for example:

- ✓ Cumulative Effects Assessment
- ✓ Indigenous Knowledge
- ✓ Local and Regional Assessment Areas

Refinement of work-plans associated with Valued Components to describe existing conditions in advance of determining potential effects to:

- ✓ Biophysical Environment
- ✓ Socioeconomic Conditions
- ✓ Human Health
