If the Indigenous community thinks it may provide confidential Indigenous Knowledge more than once during the IA process, at the outset – at the of setting out the confidentiality process via letter, agreement or MOU – the Agency can post this notice once and state that the Indigenous community has informed the Agency that some confidential IK will be shared with the Agency throughout all phases of the IA.

If this is required, the [Agency, Review Panel or Committee] will work with [name of Indigenous community] to ensure that such information is presented in a general fashion and will not disclose any sensitive details of the confidential Indigenous Knowledge. If the [Agency, Review Panel or Committee] does need to refer to this specific confidential Indigenous Knowledge in its report (for example if a specific conclusion relies on that evidence), a footnote or other notation will use the Canadian Impact Assessment Registry reference number of this notice, in order to document the source.
